Course aim:

During the course, students should master grammatical structures, vocabulary and language skills at a level that enables them to communicate about familiar topics and activities by exchanging direct and common information, writing short and simple messages, simple personal letters, as well as to understand shorter texts such as ads, shorter personal correspondence, etc. The program also includes further expansion of knowledge about the Italian culture and lifestyle, as well as the introduction of new lexical, grammatical and communicative contents adapted to the needs of law students.

Theory classes:

WEEK 1-3:

Lesson1: $Ingiro\ per\ l'Italia$ (Around Italy): Describing a city, a neighborhood. Following and giving directions. Plural forms of indefinite articles. Plural forms of nouns and adjectives ending with -co and -go. Noun - adjective agreement. Present tense of modal verbs dovere and sapere - forms and use. Articulated prepositions. Use of time and space prepositions. Elements of culture: traffic terminology.

WEEK 4-6:

Lesson 2: Andiamo in vacanza! (Let's go on a vacation!): Talking about past actions and understanding descriptions of past events. Past tense (*Passato prossimo*): regular and irregular forms and use. Time expressions. Absolute superlative forms. Use of the indefinite adjective *qualche*. Elements of culture: a trip to Italy.

WEEK 7-9:

Lesson 3: *Sapori d'Italia* (Flavors of Italy): Direct pronouns — unstressed forms. Partitive pronoun *ne*. Describing different types of shops. Doing grocery shopping. Partitive use of preposition *di*. Impersonal form with *si*. Talking about one's eating habits. Elements of culture: typical Italian food products.

WEEK 10-12:

Lesson 4: Vita quotidiana (Everyday Life): Describing one's daily routine. Present tense of reflexive verbs. Adverbs formed from adjectives. Frequency adverbs. Pasttense: passatoprossimoformofreflexiveverbs 1. Elements of culture: stereotypes about Italians, Italian holidays.

WEEK 13-15:

Lesson 5: *La famiglia* (Family): Talking and writing about one's family and family habits. Possessive adjectives (all forms). Possessive adjectives + nouns referring to family relationships. Pasttense: *passatoprossimo* formofreflexiveverbs 2. Talking about gifts and wedding customs. Causal sentences with *siccome* and *perchè*. Elements of culture: the most frequent Italian gestures.

WEEK 1-15:

Grammar and vocabulary exercises (clauses, completions, transformations), reading and listening comprehension exercises (multiple/double choice, open questions), oral and written expression exercises (role play, guided dialogue/monologue, composition writing), video material (integrated practice of all language skills).
