Week 6: WTO, international trade in goods, trade in services and trade in intellectual property rights. Week 7: Business entities and their position from the point of view of IBL. Multinational companies. Week 8: Foreign investment. Week 9: Import-export (regimes). International trade activities and international trade business. Week 10: Concession, local/small border traffic and other special forms of international trade. Week 11: Agreement on international sales (in principle) and agreement on international sales under national law. Week 12: The Vienna Convention on the International Sale of Goods. Week 13: INCOTERMS clauses. Week 14: Foreign exchange transactions. Week 15: Dispute settlement with the element of foreignness.</p>
